Class Descriptions

CL111 Chapel (1 credit)

The Chapel Service is intended to give students and staff an opportunity to worship and fellowship together. The Chapel Service is an opportunity to worship, receive a teaching from the Word, fellowship, and be built up in one's faith.

CM199 Practical Christian Ministry (3 credits) *

Students serve in various ministries or helping with various tasks on campus alongside fellow students, servants, and staff, applying the practical aspects of Christianity and servanthood as they learn to follow Christ. Four semesters of Practical Christian Ministry are required for graduation. Students must serve four hours a week under a pastor's supervision.

OT301 Old Testament Survey I: Genesis-Job (3 credits) *

The C2000 Series MP3s are recordings of Pastor Chuck Smith's "Through the Bible" messages delivered at Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa. Students will study the Bible verse-by-verse from Genesis through Job by listening to the expository messages, answering the study questions in the course guide, and writing down personal notes from the teachings. There are 88 messages for this course, at an average length of about an hour per message. This course should give the student a broad and deep understanding of God's Word, which will strengthen their relationship with God and help them understand His will for their lives.

OT302 Old Testament Survey II: Psalms-Malachi (3 credits) *

The C2000 Series MP3s are recordings of Pastor Chuck Smith's "Through the Bible" messages delivered at Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa. Students will study the Bible verse-by-verse from Psalms through Malachi by listening to the expository messages, answering the study questions in the course guide, and writing down personal notes from the teachings. There are roughly 87 messages for this course, at an average length of about an hour per message. This course should give students a broad and deep understanding of God's Word, which will strengthen their relationship with God and help them understand His will for their lives.

NT301 New Testament Survey I: Matthew-Acts (3 credits)*

The C2000 Series MP3s are recordings of Pastor Chuck Smith's "Through the Bible" messages delivered at Calvary Chapel of Costa Mesa. Students will study the Bible verse-by-verse from Matthew through Acts by listening to the expository messages, answering the study questions in the course guide, and writing down personal notes from the teachings. This course should give students a broad and deep understanding of God's Word, which will strengthen their relationship with God and help them understand His will for their lives.

NT302 New Testament Survey II: Romans-Revelation (3 credits)*

Students will study the Bible verse-by-verse from Romans through Revelation by listening to the expository messages, answering the study questions in the course guide, and writing down personal notes from the teachings. There are roughly 87 messages for this course, at an average length of about an hour per message. This course should give students a broad and deep understanding of God's Word, which will strengthen their relationship with God and help them understand His will for their lives.



TH387 Cults and World Religions (2 credits) *

TH387 is a study of cults and world religions. In this class we will first study the essential doctrines of the Christian faith. Secondly, we will briefly study the evidence for the divine inspiration and inerrancy of the Bible. Thirdly, we will define what constitutes a cult or religion. Fourthly, we will study each religion and cult and point out the differences between those belief systems with the divinely inspired Scripture. We will then explain each test for divine revelation on each of these religious systems and why they fail these tests. We will also go over the development and history associated with the cults and other world religions. Then finally, there will be discussion on how to share the truth with the spiritually lost people following the cults or other world religions.

NT354 The Gospel of John (3 credits) *

This course hopes to bring transformation to the student through a verse-by-verse study of John's gospel; it is designed to impart exegetical understanding leading to a Christ-focused passion through the text, for His glory. Upon successful completion of this course the student will understand the overall content and purpose of John's Gospel; be able to comprehend and apply each section of John; gain a deeper appreciation of the person and power of Jesus Christ; and develop a stronger passion for God and His Word.

NT355 Acts (2 credits)

This class will focus on the Biblical principles of the early church and how those principles were reflected in their practice. The Book of Acts, as Pastor Chuck says, "Is the purest model for a modern church to follow." In the same way the Book of Acts is the purest model for a mission's program. Upon successful completion of this course the student will have gained a greater understanding of how the church should function so we can become more fruitful in our service to Jesus; learn to prayerfully apply the principles of ministry we learn from the Book of Acts to our modern day ministry; and understand and be able to apply principles of missions we learn from the Book of Acts to our modern missionary endeavors.

LA331 Old Testament Hebrew (2 credits)

This course is a general overview and introduction into Hebrew grammar and syntax. Upon successful completion of this course, the student should know many common Old Testament Hebrew words, and have a sufficient understanding of Hebrew grammar to start to read the Hebrew Old Testament. Students will learn the benefits and limitations of Hebrew study aids and understand some of the reasons that translations differ. After Biblical Hebrew I and II are complete the student should be prepared to read the Hebrew Old Testament for the rest of his life with increased speed and understanding as he continues to read.

MI301 Biblical Missions (2 credits)

Missions is a major branch of theology and is to be a part of the normal Christian life. In order "To Know God and Equip His Servants," every serious student of Scripture must seriously study missions. Students in this course can expect to explore the biblical theology undergirding missions coupled with a wide variety of its practical aspects, the exposure to which will take place in readings, lively class discussions, projects, and outside opportunities. This is a diversified course for ALL believers irrespective of one's doctrinal position on the subject or sense of ministerial calling, for every Christian is called to go, send, pray, mobilize, and/or welcome
